Exciting Things are Happening at Your Children’s Home

It is hard to believe that school has started again. Thank you so much for contributing to the Back-to-School campaign. Our children will have all the supplies they need this year because of your generous support.

Fall is such a great time at the Children’s Home. The children enjoy playing outside, riding their bikes on campus, going to football games, and more. Fall is also exciting because our churches provide all the food our children need through the Fall Food Roundup. Thank you for meeting those needs.

Fall is also when our staff presents the Annual Children’s Home Report to the Churches at their associational meetings. Let me give you a preview of that report. This past year you provided love, care, and hope for over 12,000 children, families, and others. Many of those precious people experienced the joy of salvation in Christ.

Through our on-campus child and family care ministries, and our Connect 1 Child statewide foster care ministry we served 204 children and homeless mothers. Many of the children and mothers made new and renewed commitments to the Lord.

Our Granberry Counseling centers provided services for 794 clients. Our Minister Care Counseling Program provided 35 Louisiana Baptist minister families with counseling services which were provided at no cost through a partnership with the Pastoral Leadership division of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

Our Women’s Learning Center (formally Christian Women’s Job Corps) provided 37 women with educational and job skills training. The program includes the high

school equivalent program and several business certificate programs. The women have Bible study each day in class.

Our Compassion for Kids ministry, through our new Compassion Center served thousands of economically challenged children and families by providing food, coats, shoes, household items, and more. Our food distribution ministry alone is meeting the needs of over 1,000 families every month. Eighty percent of the products distributed are provided through partnerships with Baptist churches and compassion ministries in North and Central Louisiana.

Let me close by telling you about Macie. When Macie first arrived at the Children’s Home, she was only 11 years old. She had known more pain than a child should ever have to experience. But when she stepped onto our campus, she was welcomed with open arms and loved by our caring staff. This summer, something truly remarkable happened in Macie’s life. She attended Vacation Bible School, where she experienced the unconditional love of Christ in a way she had never known before. Shortly after, Macie made the life-changing decision to accept Jesus as her Savior. Her life, which was once filled with fear and uncertainty, is now grounded in peace, joy, and hope.

Macie’s story is just one of many, but it serves as a powerful reminder of the incredible impact your support is making in the lives of children and families in need. Because of your great love and care, children like Macie not only find a safe and loving, Christian home but also the promise of eternal life. Thank you for being the hands and feet of Jesus at your Louisiana Baptist Children’s Home..

LBCH On-Campus Cottage/Foster Parents

Jan and Randy Lee — Joy Cottage

Jan and Randy Lee have faithfully served as Cottage Parents at Joy Cottage for over 11 years, answering a clear and compelling call from God. With a lifelong commitment to children’s ministry, they felt led to step into the ministry at Louisiana Baptist Children’s Home, bringing their hearts, experience, and faith to children in need.

Originally from Omaha, Nebraska, Jan and Randy raised four children before pursuing ministry full-time. Jan ran an in-home daycare until their youngest child started school, while Randy felt called to attend seminary in New Orleans. The couple settled in Baton Rouge, where Randy completed coursework at a seminary extension and Jan continued teaching and ministering in a variety of church and school settings. Together, they bring years of experience serving in children’s, worship, and women’s ministries, as well as teaching in private Christian schools.

Over the years, the Lees have witnessed remarkable transformations. One story that stands out is a young boy who came to Joy Cottage in 2017. Aggressive and angry at first, and academically far behind for his age, he left three years later reading, curious about faith, and expressing a desire to follow Jesus. “He had a calm spirit, loved school, and was full of questions about Jesus,” Jan and Randy recall.

What brings them the greatest pride is providing children with a sense of normal family life—celebrating birthdays and holidays, enjoying dinners out, vacations, and learning the importance of chores, play, and supporting one another. They hope every child in their care experiences what it means to be part of a loving, God-centered family.

If they could say one thing to every child they’ve cared for, it would be: “Please remember how much we love you and how much Jesus loves you. Share His love with others and follow Him all the days of your life.” Two verses that have guided their home since their first year at LBCH are displayed in their dining room:

“For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” – Jeremiah 29:11

“As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.” – Joshua 24:15

Many former residents continue to stay in touch, sharing memories, seeking advice, or simply reminiscing about life at Joy Cottage. Through their unwavering faith, warmth, and guidance, Jan and Randy Lee continue to reflect Christ’s love, creating a home where children can grow, thrive, and experience hope.

Here’s the amazing part: while the Compassion Center was still under construction, God was already providing the Bibles through the faithfulness of these students!


Back-To-School Block Party

Slowing Down to See God



As summer comes to an end and the pace of the school year begins to pick up, I recently had the chance to take one of our teens, Cassie, out to lunch. On the surface, it may have looked like a simple outing, just a meal and a conversation. But for us, it has become something far more meaningful.

Over her time at Louisiana Baptist Children’s Home, this young woman and I have shared numerous little interactions. From quick hallway check-ins and car rides to long talks and laughter in everyday moments, those small investments have grown into a relationship built on trust and safety. Over lunch that day, I could see how God has used those countless moments to build a connection strong enough that Cassie felt comfortable opening her heart.

She talked about her excitement for the new school year, but her joy didn’t stop there. Her excitement was unmistakable as she talked about her case moving toward permanency. In that moment, I was reminded that God is always working, even in the times that feel routine, even in the tasks that seem small.

It is easy to get caught up in the demands of the job—deadlines, meetings, and the weight of constant responsibilities. But sitting across from Cassie, I was reminded of something far greater: this is Kingdom work. These lunches, these conversations, these ordinary moments are the very spaces where God allows us to reflect His love, His faithfulness, and His promise of redemption.

Jesus’ words in Matthew 19:14 remind me of this calling: “Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these.” Slowing down and enjoying these moments with the children we serve helps us keep perspective. It refreshes us, reminding us not only of who we serve, but also of Who we serve for.

That lunch was more than a meal. It was a reminder of why we do this work. For Cassie, it was a safe space to be heard and to celebrate her story. For me, it was God’s gentle nudge to remember that He is using even the smallest of interactions to write a bigger story, one filled with hope, healing, and His unfailing love.

And this truth isn’t just for social workers. Teachers, Sunday school leaders, parents, and mentors—you too are shaping lives in ways you may not even realize. The short conversations before class starts, the encouraging word after a hard day, the laughter shared on the way home. These are Kingdom moments. They may feel small, but they are laying foundations of safety and trust in the children God has placed in your care. This is the work of God in and through you. Your ministry is happening in those daily interactions, and they matter more than you know.

As we begin this new school year, I pray we carry with us the reminder that the most extraordinary Kingdom work often happens in the ordinary moments—one conversation, one laugh, one shared meal at a time.

Client Finds Relief from Physical Symptoms Through EMDR



God tells us in Psalm 139:13-15 (NIV), “For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother’s womb. I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well. My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.”

Life experiences can often have a negative and even traumatic impact upon a person. And many times those experiences that are not adequately processed begin to have a negative impact on the physical body. Many people are not aware that physical symptoms such as chronic fatigue syndrome, rheumatoid arthritis, migraine headaches and others can be related to those unprocessed negative life experiences.

When there are multiple negative experiences throughout life that go unprocessed, anxiety and depression can begin to negatively impact a person. Anxiety and depression are the two primary reasons people present to counselors. There is often a correlation between physical symptoms and emotional symptoms. In Dr. Mark Grant’s book, *Change Your Brain, Change Your Pain*, he explains that “the medial prefrontal cortex (mPFC) links the body and the brain.” He goes on to explain how the memory of pain gets stored in the body, causing some of the symptoms mentioned above.

One of the tools we use at Granberry Counseling Centers is EMDR therapy (Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing). It’s a psychotherapy technique used to help individuals process and heal from traumatic or distressing life experiences.

When working with clients to help them process trauma using EMDR therapy, the brain desensitizes the negative impact of their emotions, their negative beliefs about self, and their physical sensations.

While working with a client who had multiple physical ailments that were debilitating and keeping her from enjoying life, she was able to experience release from much of her physical pain. Her physical symptoms had been so painful at times that she was unable to attend a number of counseling sessions. As the trauma was processed through EMDR therapy, many of the physical symptoms began to subside. After the last session, when all the trauma had been processed, the client reported relief from the physical symptoms. The client was very grateful to be experiencing a new quality of life.

God created us with the ability to heal from many of life’s negative, traumatic experiences so that we can become fully devoted followers of Christ and serve Him with our whole heart. Granberry Counseling Centers have eleven locations across the state. Our counselors are here to answer God’s call to care.
