CAMPUS SPOTLIGHT:LBCH Cottage Care Manager



Kathy LaCaze — Maggie's Place - HomePlace

For Kathy LaCaze, serving at Maggie's Place wasn't just a job—it was a divine assignment. After stepping away from her full-time role at LifeWay and preparing for what she thought would be a new chapter in Pennsylvania, God redirected her steps in a way she never expected. During the Louisiana Baptist Convention, Dr. Perry Hancock approached her with a simple question: "Have you ever thought about being a relief mom?" In that moment, Kathy knew—this was where the Lord was calling her.

Now, after more than 18 years of faithful service, Kathy continues to pour her heart into the women and children who come through Maggie's Place, a HomePlace ministry cottage that provides shelter, support, and spiritual guidance to homeless mothers and their children.

Before coming to the Louisiana Baptist Children's Home, Kathy had a long and successful career in retail leadership, serving as a district manager for L'eggs, a co-manager at Hobby Lobby, and eventually as an assistant manager at LifeWay—a role she considered a gift from God. During her time at LifeWay, she and her husband had the opportunity to go on mission trips, including one to LSU. Then, in 2003, tragedy struck when Kathy lost her husband. It was a defining moment that would deepen her faith and prepare her for the next chapter—one that would overflow with purpose and love.

For the first three years at LBCH, Kathy served as a relief mom, which she describes as a gift—especially as someone who had never been able to have children of her own. She split her time between the main campus in Monroe and Seller's Maternity Home in Baton Rouge, caring for pregnant teenagers. Then, in 2010, she became the manager of Maggie's Place, where she's continued her ministry ever since.

Throughout her years of service, Kathy has witnessed the hand of God move in powerful, undeniable ways. She's seen mothers and children give their hearts to Jesus and lives transformed by the hope and healing only He can bring. And while there are many success stories, her proudest moments are the ones where she's seen the Lord work through every challenge and every victory.

If she could say one thing to every child she's cared for, it would be simple and true: "I love you." Her deepest hope is that every mother and child who leaves Maggie's Place will always remember two things—that Jesus loves them, and so does she. And they do remember. Kathy still hears from many of her former residents, continuing relationships that began with trust, blossomed with care, and remain rooted in love.

At Maggie's Place, Kathy LaCaze has created more than a refuge—it's a home, a sanctuary, and a reminder that even in life's hardest moments, God's love never fails. Through her faithful service, Kathy has become not only a guide and mentor, but a living example of what it means to walk in obedience, trust God's plan, and love like Christ.

Finding Success One Step At A Time

This semester at the Women's Learning Center, we began with the idea of "stepping stones." Each woman took a stone and wrote her name on it. It marked a step in the journey she was on. Some were just starting their journeys; others have been walking this path for two or three years. We talk continually about how each step is one more in the direction God has for us. When we look back, we are amazed at how far each has come, even when the steps seemed so small.

This month, I'd like to celebrate and give thanks to the Lord for some of the steps He has helped these women accomplish since August. One has been praying for months for an answer to a sudden and unexpected financial change. Her answer came. All her bills are paid and caught up! Another woman has just begun her third year with us. She is determined. She recently passed her fourth test. She is now working on her last subject. An online student once came as a speaker. Later, she shared that she needed her high school diploma and joined us online. She is now on her last subject and nearly ready to test. A career student had been searching for a job for nearly a year. This month, she was hired as an administrative assistant.

Our stories could continue. For each and every one, we thank the Lord for His mercy and His direction. No step or stone has been easy, but none has been taken alone. We walk with the Lord, surrounded by each other's—and your—prayers and encouragement. This Thanksgiving, we pray that you turn each of your steps, whether easy or hard, into an offering of praise.

From Darkness to Light Anna's Story

Anna's life is a powerful reminder that God's grace can reach into even the darkest places and bring healing, hope, and new life.

Born in Louisiana, Anna grew up in a difficult home. Raised by a single mother who struggled with substance abuse and mental health, Anna and her siblings faced years of instability and pain. Her mother was often physically and emotionally abusive. Her words and actions left deep scars. Anna never felt loved or wanted. She longed for someone to see her, to care for her, and to tell her she mattered.

There were moments of real danger and heartbreak. On one occasion, a caregiver's reckless actions caused injury to Anna and one of her siblings. Anna never received proper medical care, and her wounds went untreated—both physically and emotionally. A family member who made hurtful comments about her skin color added to the rejection Anna already felt. Over time, the weight of it all became unbearable, and Anna was hospitalized after threatening to take her own life.

But even in her darkest moments, God was watching over her. When Anna entered foster care, He placed her with the Thomas family, a home filled with love, kindness, and faith. The Thomases welcomed her as one of their own and introduced her to church for the first time. Surrounded by believers, Anna began to hear about a God who loved her unconditionally and had a purpose for her life.

As she attended church with the Thomases, Anna became active in the children's ministry and started to experience joy she had never known before. In 2023, while attending Vacation Bible School, Anna gave her heart to Jesus and made a public profession of faith. After many heartfelt conversations with the Thomases about what it means to follow Christ, she decided to be baptized that summer—declaring to the world that she belongs to Him. Today, Anna continues to grow in her faith and walk with the Lord. Her story is a beautiful testimony of God's redeeming power—turning pain into purpose, and sorrow into joy.

LBCH Implements Short-Term Care Initiative



LBCH has launched an expansion of our Foster Care ministries through a program called, Bridges of Hope. Through this program we will work with the Louisiana Department of Children and Family Services to provide initial short-term care for children abruptly removed from their homes.

Feazel Cottage, on our Monroe campus, will serve as the first cottage for this initiative. It will be known as Friendship House for the Bridges of Hope program.

Friendship House will be a place of safety where the children brought into care won't have to worry about the neglect or abuse that many of them have experienced. They will be welcomed with love, kindness, and encouragement during a difficult time. Please be in prayer as we begin this new journey.

MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

• LOUISIANA BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOME & FAMILY MINISTRIES

In its 126th year of ministry Louisiana Baptist Children's Home and Family Ministries continued its mission of providing love, care, and hope in Christ for children and families in need.

The Children's Home provided ministry services for over 12,800 children, families, and individuals

• RESIDENTIAL FOSTER AND FAMILY CARE

Served 204 children and homeless mothers through on-campus and off-campus residential ministries. An additional 330 families received placement referral services.

• GRANBERRY COUNSELING CENTERS

Provided professional Christian counseling for 794 individuals through multiple statewide locations. Provided counseling for 35 Louisiana Baptist minister families in partnership with the Louisiana Baptist Convention Pastoral Leadership Team.

• WOMEN'S LEARNING CENTER

Provided 37 women with educational and job skills training. Maintained adult education certification as an official HiSET training and testing site. In 2024, the Center offered its first online courses. WLC staff lead students in Bible study and prayer daily.


COMPASSION FOR KIDS - THE COMPASSION CENTER

With the addition of the new Compassion Center in Monroe, the Children's Home Served over 11,500 economically challenged children and family members. Items provided include diapers, toys, backpacks, school supplies, food, and other life essentials. Hundreds of Bibles and thousands of gospel tracts were distributed.

• INTERNATIONAL ORPHAN CARE — LOUISIANA REACH HAITI

Served 34 children through Louisiana Reach Haiti. The children's village in Croix-des-Bouquets was relocated to Cap Haitien.

- We received no state or federal funding for the care of children
- 50% of all funding comes from individuals and churches
- Only 25% of funding goes to administrative costs
- 75% of funding goes directly to ministry services
- 7% of funding comes from payment of services (Granberry Counseling Centers)

The Compassion Center — Compassion For Kids Update

2025 has been a monumental, historic year for the ministries of LBCH! With a Grand Opening in April and full operation in mid-May, The Compassion Center and hit the ground running immediately. Compassion For Kids (CFK) has distributed over 8,000 food boxes to clients in our food distribution program since we opened. On average, we are now giving 500 food boxes every week. In August, Compassion For Kids provided 16 ministry partners with 12,000 articles of new clothing and shoes. In September, CFK provided five partners with over 20,000 diapers. The overall impact of this ministry is truly incalculable! The needs surrounding us are being felt more and more as word spreads through the community. Each week, we receive 40-50 new application for food assistance.

One of the many highlights of CFK is certainly our volunteer group. Each week, dozens of volunteers from surrounding churches faithfully come to The Compassion Center to tape boxes, sort new food intake, fill food boxes, and distribute them to our clients. However, our volunteers do much more than that! Most importantly, every single one of our volunteers greets our food distribution clients with a smile and a heart that says, "You are valued here. You are loved." Each Tuesday and Thursday morning, we gather together as a team to pray over the dear people who will come through our food line, and those cherished people are beginning to understand that we are here for more than providing food. We often encounter those who are in need of prayer, and they trust our team to pray with them, to encourage them...to give them the attention and care they need. We also hear from our ministry partners how these resources are making a difference in the lives of those they minister to. One lady named NeNe was blessed so much by the clothing provided to Grace Place (one of our

ministry partners) that she developed a desire to go to church. Eventually, she and her family were in church, dedicated their lives to Jesus, and were baptized! And as a result of her newfound faith, NeNe has begun to care for others around her in ways that demonstrate a life change that can only be explained by the transformative love of Jesus!

CFK plans to provide an additional 21,000 diapers to partners in November and another 12,000 articles of clothing and shoes to ministry partners in early December ahead of Christmas. We greatly appreciate our generous donors in Texas, Arkansas, Florida, and Louisiana who make this possible. Exciting things are happening every day at The Compassion Center. God is moving in incredible ways, some seen and some unseen. Our team is humbled and thrilled with the opportunities ahead of us. We greatly appreciate your prayers as you pray for the ministry and for those we are blessed to serve!



As she looks toward retirement, Dr. Eichelberger is stepping down from her leadership role but will continue seeing clients part-time in the Monroe office.
